# KANTOR NOTES

Why do we sing the Psalms? Wouldn't it be easier to understand if the Psalms were spoken instead of sung?

"The Psalms are poems, and poems are intended to be sung, not doctrinal treatises, nor even sermons" (C. S. Lewis, *Reflections on the Psalms*, 1958, p.2). The book of Psalms contains very ancient material used for chants in the Jerusalem temple. It is written as Semitic poetry which does not rhyme but instead repeats an idea in different words. (Maybe the singer will "get it" the second time! Or perhaps two choirs alternated the ideas expressed in the poem; we simply do not know.) It does cause one to really think about how the two ways of saying something connect, contrast or amplify the thoughts. It is a very cerebral poetry not just a rhyme for the ears.

Musically, we know very little about *how* the songs were sung. There *are* Hebrew directions given in the Psalms that mean to accompany the singing with a flute or string instrument. But many of these directive terms have become obscure in meaning like the term "Selah" which experts guess may have meant a refrain for all voices.

I confess that when singing the Psalms, I find my mind concentrating on the correct musical pitches and sometimes missing the meaning. One suggestion is to meditate on the Psalm for the day during the prelude.

- Try to find the parallel meanings. For instance, in Psalm 23 to sing "I shall not want" is really to amplify the first thought "the Lord is my shepherd".
- Also look for sub-themes.

The 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm begins and ends with the Lord's provision now and for all time.

Verses 2 & 5 deal with food and drink.

Verses 3 & 4b describe security, rescue and comfort.

The center of the Psalm, verse 4a stands alone and tells us to fear no evil not even death.

Delving into the building blocks of this Semitic poetry before actually singing it will help the understanding of it immensely. It is true that everything worthwhile takes effort.

Another suggestion to help the senses grow is to listen to all the lessons without looking at the bulletin. Hearing only is how it was done for thousands of years. At first it isn't easy, but with practice it is a very rich and satisfying experience. The printed word is always there for referral later.

In conclusion, it would not be incorrect to read the Psalms instead of singing them. But we are trying to use the Psalms in the manner in which they were intended. Preparation and focused practice will make the experience more satisfying, until one sees it as a privilege we alone have in Grove City. (Other churches sometimes use the cantor as a Psalm soloist and the assembly sings a repeated phrase.)

## **ADULT SUMMER SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS**


